5.1	Main Road Phone Box:	
	AG reported that she had been in touch with the Land Registry, who confirmed that the land where the phone box is to be sited is not registered to anyone and therefore planning permission was not needed. She had also spoken to Nigel, i/c the Jesse Boot Homes, who was enthusiastic about the project. She had received a quote of £600 for the refurbishment of the exterior of the box.  RS pledged £300 towards this from the Wilford fireworks event. AG to follow up pricing and timescale  Discussion on the possibility of the box housing a defibrillator led to the fact that South Wilford School	AG / RS
	were purchasing a cabinet to house theirs at a cost of £600, and it was agreed that WCG would share this amount. PH to donate £300 from the Group.	PH
	Heritage Trail:	
	DA reported that a series of A3 or A2 information boards would be installed at significant historical sites around Wilford, an oral history would be built up by interviewing longstanding residents (hoping to involve local schoolchildren), and the trail would be launched with a heritage festival, ca. August 2020.	
	He had had an encouraging meeting with Heritage Lottery representatives and is now applying for a £12k grant. In association with this, it was deemed appropriate that the phone box should be used to house a local history display	DA

8	Ruddington Lane Park			
8.1	RS and AR were delighted to announce that the funding had been obtained for the renovation of Ruddington Lane Park, with everything on the original plans being approved, ie an expansion of the outdoor gym and a refurbishment/expansion of the children's play area, including the replacement of the bark chippings with a spongy material. Further Information attached Appendix A.  The failed wildflower meadow is to be restored to grassland and a wildflower corridor to be sown on either side of the park, 1 metre- and 2 metre- widths respectively. It was felt that the community should be involved in the selection of a more inclusive name for the park and possibly in the design of decorative gates, which were being considered as a replacement for the rocks currently discouraging travellers. 
